"When we picked Noah up after camp, he couldn't stop talking. Cabin mates! Swimming! Tree top trekking! Fishing! He was all smiles, just pure joy. My heart jumped into my throat when he talked about the treetops. We're both afraid of heights! Me more than him, obviously, but I couldn't believe it! It's one of those activities I had never even imagined—the fact that it's accessible and that he was able to just jump up and do it like any other kid?! And he was so proud

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that he got a swimming band that meant he didn't need a jacket, just a pool noodle. My little fish in the water! He loves swimming and feels so free when he can propel himself so well using just his arms.

Even from the moment he got on the wheelchair accessible bus, I knew he was in good hands. I sent along an essay of instructions and even his medical complexities were never a big deal. He never heard 'no we can't do that'. He only heard about adventures, challenges, and opportunities. And he also had quiet, gentle moments with his cabin mates and counsellors—when he mentioned his buddy Alex, neither of us knew he was talking about the CEO of Campfire Circle! It felt like forever but it also went so quick. My husband and I slept in, stayed out late, even got out of the city for a few nights, too. I didn't realize how much I missed him until I saw him—and he was just beaming, bursting and bubbling with stories. **HE IS COUNTING THE DAYS UNTIL HE CAN GO BACK, AND RECOUNTING AND RELIVING HIS CAMP**
